Status of the Fund

Thank you for supporting Unity in the Community - Kitsap's COVID-19 Response Fund! Because of you and other donors, the Fund has provided a supberb amount of targeted assistance to our community. On the following pages of this Grant Report, you'll find a list of all of the grants made from the Fund. We have yet to distribute some of the Funds because we are still actively developing Relationship Needs grants. And I'm pleased to announce that we are launching a fundraising effort to raise funds specifically for the Equitable Community Needs focus area.

\$395,000 has been donated to the Fund, largely from the following contributors: United Way of Kitsap County, The Ballmer Group, Columbia Bank, First Federal Community Foundation, Medina Foundation, Orchard Foods, Perigee Fund, Puget Sound Energy, Sparky's Fund, Town & Country Markets, and Windermere Foundation (Poulsbo Office).

Funding Focus Areas

Working together to administer the Fund, Kitsap Community Foundation and United Way of Kitsap have defined four focus areas that the fund is supporting or intends to support.

- **Basic needs**: food, meals, and resource support for physical/mental/behavioral health services for our most vulnerable neighbors in the community.
- **Relationship needs**: offering ways to reduce toxic stress and connect our resilient community in a safe and caring way during a time when physical distancing is our best public safety measure.
- Nonprofit needs: support to nonprofits that are at risk of failing if funding is not available in the longer term.
- **Kitsap Racial Equity and Empowerment Fund**: support for culturally relevant programs, services, and activities in Kitsap that are aimed at lessening the inequities caused or exacerbated by the COVID-19 crisis in or for communities of color, with an emphasis on the needs of the Black community.

7/1/2020	Kitsap Immigrant Assistance Center	\$10,000.00	The grant funds will be placed into KIAC's Emergency Assistance Fund, which provides direct support to families as the requests for help with rent and food continue to come in. 100% of the Emergency Assistance Fund goes to local immigrant families experiencing exceptional need, and inevitably toxic stress along with that need, in the form of food and rent assistance.
6/29/2020	Scarlet Road	\$1,500.00	Subsequent funding will provide additional safe and positive experiences in community for 20 survivors and their families during the summer through offering summer fun baskets, food, and activities for their healing.
6/29/2020	Bethany Lutheran Church, School and Early Learning Center (ELC)	\$2,000.00	Funding helps to continue hosting a series of weekly summer reading events for famililes over 5 weeks that socially connects a community in a safe physical distancing way during COVID -19. Families (determined by the cars) can keep the two books read together as a community for bedtime. Families will also be invited to select additional books from a "book buffet table" in a way adhering to public health guidelines.
6/15/2020	Bainbridge Youth Services	\$3,000.00	Fund 1:1 free counseling for teens and a counselor for every two guardians/parents for free parent coaching. Fund engaging activities, i.e., a social media campaign and biweekly youth-led virtual social events for 3 months. Coaching and counseling are accessible to all of Kitsap requiring efforts to bridge connections through Graduate Strong network partners.
6/15/2020	Kids in Concert	\$5,000.00	Fund resources to expand and provide musical educational services throughout the summer to our families. This is new work because of COVID and an unanticipated expense. With the expected closure of all/most other summer learning programs and recreational activities, the musical education and programing provided over the summer will be of increased value to families.
5/28/2020	Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe	\$750.00	All S'Klallam and Suquamish tribal elders have been completely isolated and are in need of some essential household items to help them through this COVID-19 "Stay Healthy Stay Home" order (the effects of COVID-19 in Kitsap County are expected to last into June). Between the two tribes there are approximately 250 elders isolated and in need, the most-needed items include the following: First Aid Kits, Ice Packs, Hand Sanitizer, Toilet Paper (individually packed or wrapped), Toothpaste, Anti-bacterial Soap, Disinfecting Wipes, Dish Soap, Laundry Soap.

5/16/2020	Kitsap SAIVS (Special Assault Investigations And Victim's Services)	\$300.00	Creation of a "journal book" to replicate some of the activities offered at camp. Camp RISE is building 22 "gift baskets" that remind youth survivors of DV and sex trafficking the camp core principles: Resilience, Insight, Strength and Empowerment.
5/16/2020	Harvest Against Hunger	\$1,600.00	Funding to purchase 40,000 pounds of potatoes that will be delivered for free to our County. Foodbanks will bag and distribute the potatoes.
5/16/2020	Kitsap County Food Bank Association	\$48,400.00	Food for Area Food Banks
5/16/2020	Kitsap Harvest	\$500.00	Funding ~35 adults to fulfill a participant background check. Gleaning provides positive memory and skill-building experiences for families quarantined in a volunteer capacity. Provides households access to healthy produce.
5/16/2020	Native Horsemanship Youth Program	\$1,100.00	Funds equipment and supplies needed to safely provide positive memory-building experiences for tribal and non-tribal families quarantined together healing from trauma-related needs. Held with experienced therapy horses. No cost
5/16/2020	New Life Community Development Agency	\$3,375.00	Funds 75% of production and presenter costs for health education sessions held monthly virtually (2) and in person (2 per CDC and state ordered guidelines). Offered by presenters in a culturally relevant way understanding their needs and the challenges.
5/16/2020	Olive Crest	\$17,250.00	Building staff capacity for relational mentoring for foster youth ϑ families (start with training/admin). Funds safe in-person visitations serving 37 foster families weekly for 6-8 weeks, delivering meals and activities, additional case management.
